- ◆ The Library's online catalog grew to over a million items owned by the fourteen public libraries in Waukesha County who formed the CAFÉ (Catalog Access for Everyone) partnership.
- ◆ The Library received the Wisconsin Library Association's WEBBIE AWARD for 'Best Site for Kids.'
- ◆ Einstein's Big Idea programs funded by a WGBH-PBS TV grant drew more than 1,000 interested community members.
