
Dear Citizens of the Waukesha community:



CAFÉ: Catalog Access for Everyone

Our partnership of libraries continued to grow in 2004. Customers are able to search on-line for the holdings of all CAFÉ members. A universal library card acceptable at all member libraries will soon be available.

Member libraries now include Big Bend, Brookfield, Butler, Mukwonago, Muskego, Sussex/Lisbon and Waukesha. Seven additional libraries are expected to join the CAFÉ group in August 2005.
